This is a practical tool that will help us see where we are and pray about where God wants to take us.

I am a strategy geek, so things like this really excite me. You will hear more, but please pray for the process. We want to do everything we can to do what God has called us to do.

The Servant Leadership Team Update — April 2024

Following is a summary of some of the things discussed at the Servant Leader meetings:

- National Day of Prayer Thursday May 2nd Theme: "Lift up the Word Light up the World". There will be a community event on the Town Common starting at 6:50PM.
- We are bringing back our annual tradition of First Responder Recognition Sunday on April 28th.
- The Safety team met with the Fire and Police chiefs to discuss a safety plan for FCCB.
- Pastor Zac would like to do a Bible directed study on leadership during the Servant Leadership Team Ministry meeting.
- Servant Leaders looked at attendance trends for the past year and discussed how to best utilize seating in the church as attendance grows.

NATIONAL CHURCH DEVELOPMENT SURVEY (NCD)

Item E-15/page 13 of the FCCB Constitution and By-Laws states: "Sometime during each leap year, the Pastor and Servant Leadership Team (SLT) will...lead the church in a thorough evaluation of its spiritual and organizational health resulting in long range plans that will lead the church into ongoing revitalization."

To address this responsibility, we voted and approved the purchase and implementation of the National Church Development Survey (NCD) in the next 90 days. This widely known and utilized diagnostic tool will enable us to precisely assess our present quality and help us identify the area(s) of greatest opportunity for improvement. Surveys will be provided to a sample of church members representing broad, preselected (by NCD) demographic criteria. We look forward to sharing the results of the NCD Survey later this year. 
