I have a question for you. Do you have a place and have your people? This may seem like an odd sentence, but I think part of belonging to a church is this — having a place and having your people. I'm not just talking about worship on a Sunday morning, which is important. I'm talking about knowing others and serving others.

I'm talking about how our church breaks down into smaller groups of *study* and *service*. If you only worship on Sunday mornings, you miss out on all God has for you as part of the church. God calls us to serve one another and the world with the gifts he has given us. You have a gift that God has given to you. St. Paul told the church in Corinth this:

"A spiritual gift is given to each of us so we can help each other." — 1 Corinthians 12:7

When we don't use our spiritual gifts, our church misses out on what you have to offer, and you miss out on the blessing to serve others.

But, if all we do is serve, we will burn out. This is why we need our people — people we pray with, people we encourage, people we engage scripture with — the people we build up and build us up. There are so many "*one another*" passages in scripture. We are at a place in the life of our church where this "one another-ing" is quite difficult on Sunday morning during worship. But we do have opportunities for you to find your people. We have a few different Bible study options of which we would love for you to be part.


